

## INQUEST ON TROLLEY WRECK.

NEWARK, Feb. 23.—The funeral of Miss Jennie Estelle McLelland, the last victim of the Clifton Avenue grade crossing accident, took place to-day. The condition of other victims of the disaster still in the hospitals was unchanged to-night.

Motorman Brady recovered consciousness at St. Michael's this evening. He knows all that goes on about him and can recall happenings of a week ago, but Thursday morning is wholly a blank to him. He seems not to know how he was hurt. The doctors in the hospital say his mind is a blank for the time being, but that memory may return slowly, and again, it may never recur to him what took place from the moment his car began to slide down the incline.

Coroner Helleman will begin taking testimony on Wednesday and officers from the Prosecutor's office have been busy summoning school children as witnesses.

Principal Stearns of the High School has postponed indefinitely the proposed memorial services at the High School arranged for to-morrow. The reason given is that the teachers and principals were of the impression that such services would unfit the scholars for hard work for several days. The school has already been much upset.

As a result of the catastrophe the trolley company has had two derailing switches placed in position at the fatal crossing. The work on the switches was begun Saturday afternoon and they were placed in operation yesterday. A man is stationed at each switch to operate it when necessary.
